Topic: Combating human rights violations in the Gaza Strip

*The United Nations Human Rights Council,*

*Bearing in mind* the utmost importance of financial aid in an international conflict,

*Aware of* the pivotal role assumed by collaboration between different organs in the UN, which can collectively work in order to solve worldwide issues,

*Convinced that* each country, working with others, can contribute a great deal in solving said problematics and consequently save hundreds of innocent lives,

*Believing* the effectiveness that unblocking the borders and implementing security measures in them may have,

*Recognizing* the importance of safe spaces where the conflict's victims can go to and also the need for a secure and reliable network which will allow the citizens to move in between the affected areas,

*Noting with regret* the ineffectiveness of all proposed solutions unless the rules breaching countries or parties are faced with serious consequences,

*Hoping* that each country will put aside all past tensions, problematics and personal interests in order to save innocent lives currently at risk,

1. Requests the creation of an international fund with a contribution based on GDP, which will be used in order to:

a) acquiring:

i. food and goods

ii. medical aid

iii. infrastructure,

b) providing monetary support to conflict or wish to help;

2. Suggests a collaboration with the UNGA, which will help establishing:

a) all those countries unable to help financially (LEDCS), which will help by:

- i. implementing awareness campaigns,
  - ii. guaranteeing the safe passage of aid,
- b) the exact percentage of GDP, which will be given to the established fund;
3. Encourages the engagement in bilateral agreements between countries with the purpose of, but not limited to:
  - a) allowing the safe passage of aid into Gaza,
  - b) giving to the severely injured ones the chance to escape, through humanitarian pathways established with said agreements, the conflicted areas;
4. Calls upon the creation of a UNBP (UN mission on border protection) which will guarantee the borders' protection on both sides, in order to end the blockade;
5. Endorses the establishment of meeting points where people can go in case of emergency and also safe networks between these points in order to move the people safely, which will be monitored by international UN workers;
6. Further requests for a collaboration between the UNHRC and UNSC in order to establish monetary penalties decided by the security council directed to all those countries or groups which breach the international HR laws;
7. Decides to remain actively seized on the matter.
